▶ Auckland International Airport strengthens their commitment to environmental compliance

Auckland Airport is a major South Pacific hub for air travel, airfreight and other related commercial operations. With over 300 business and 10,000 people employed within the airport community, AIA are committed to growing business in a sustainable manner, proactively working to mitigate the environmental and social impacts of our operations and enhancing New Zealand's reputation as a clean, green, safe haven.

This includes encouraging the up-take of new technologies and better practices to work more efficiently.

Because of Auckland Airport's (AIA) location – on the shores of the Manukau Harbour and adjacent to major residential and business areas – AIA take environmental compliance responsibilities seriously.

That means operating in a manner that minimizes impact on local community and groundwater management, air quality, wildlife conservation and noise control.

Environmental Officer Kate Edenborough says prior to CS-VUE, compliance of consents was managed in an ad-hoc manner and not kept in one central location. This provided challenges in that it was very time consuming and reliant on responsible staff performing without reporting back.

CS-VUE allows staff to log on and report completed compliance duties and also provides the useful reminder prior to a condition requiring action.

Kate categorically states that she has not been able to find any other similar product on the market, so therefore, the decision to implement CS-VUE was an easy one.
